



About the Position

The Public Art Committee (PAC), a subcommittee of the Cultural Arts Commission (LCAC), is a volunteer, community based advisory group appointed by City Council to review proposals and make recommendations regarding the selection and display of public artwork. The PAC works closely with the Arts and Cultural Resources Department to plan and implement public art programming for the Community.

Details

- The seven members serve three-year terms. One member serves as a member of LCAC and PAC and acts as a liaison between the two groups. There are two alternate members.
- Meetings are held on the second Wednesday of the month at 7 pm at The Collective Community Arts Center, 201 N. Public Road.

Requirements & Duties

- Resident of Lafayette for at least 12 months (prior to appointment)
- Registered voter
- Attend monthly meetings
- Attend other meetings or volunteer at special events to promote work of the committee.

Members are responsible for:

- Selecting public art for the annual Art on the Street sculpture on loan program and making recommendations for the purchase of public art for the permanent collection.
- Making recommendations to the Public Art Coordinator regarding budgets, goals, and objectives for public art in Lafayette.
- Making recommendations and assisting with marketing and promotion of PAC projects and programs through social networks.
- Supporting programs, including Art on the Street, See & Respond Art show and reception, Art Night Out.

Desired Qualifications or Interests

The Public Art Committee (PAC) looks for residents who want to guide, assist, and advocate for public art in Lafayette. Candidates should appreciate and value the role of arts and culture in our community.
