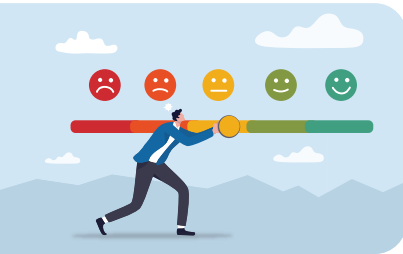


Watch for the Resident Survey in June

Willoughby Corner receives City Council approval for Phase 1

A major step toward beginning construction on one of the largest mixed-use and environmentally sustainable affordable housing neighborhoods ever built in Boulder County occurred in April with City Council's approval of the Willoughby Corner site plan. Willoughby Corner will be the largest net-zero affordable housing development in the state of Colorado, ultimately providing 400 new rental and for sale affordable homes for those earning at or below 60 percent of the Area Median Income.

Plans for the Willoughby Corner neighborhood began in 2017 when the City of Lafayette purchased 24 acres at 120th and Emma Streets to solidify an affordable housing collaboration with the Boulder County Housing Authority (BCHA). Lafayette has continued to be a financial partner with BCHA to bring affordable workforce housing to the Lafayette community through the Willoughby project. Construction is expected to begin in May with lease dates beginning in 2024. Learn more at WilloughbyCorner.org.

Water Restrictions

The following restrictions are in place year-round in Lafayette

A reminder of Lafayette's year-round water restrictions

Reducing outdoor water use reduces our carbon footprint, saves energy, protects the regional water supply, and using less water saves money on your utility bill. Watering restrictions were put in place in 2013 to protect the City's water resources. These conservation practices are beneficial regardless of drought conditions.

Violations of Municipal Code Section 120-13 are subject to fines.

New Restriction Effective June 2022:

- Outdoor irrigation is limited to a maximum of 3 days per week
- **NO** watering of outdoor landscaping between the hours of 10am and 6pm except:
 - Watering by hand with a hose equipped with an automatic shut-off valve
 - City-owned facilities: golf course, high traffic parks, and athletic fields
 - Commercial agriculture
- **NO** overrun of water onto any area not covered by vegetation such as sidewalks, curbs, driveways, streets, and other paved areas
- **NO** washing of paved areas such as driveways with a hose

Fix broken sprinkler heads

Water lawns, plants, and trees – not roads and sidewalks. Check to see if your irrigation heads are broken, tilted, or not set-up properly by scheduling a free irrigation assessment through the Lafayette Waterwise Program.
